


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Teacher Feedback Report (2016-17)

From the year 2015-16, the college initiated the process of collecting feedback from teachers regarding academic satisfaction and their inputs about college infrastructure which would help the college to improve its facilities for the future. The college earlier existed as Ram Lal Anand College (Evening) and turned into a morning college as Aryabhatta College in the academic session 2015-16. The college decided in 2016-17 to collect feedback from both teachers and students. It was decided to collect feedback from teachers by requesting them to fill out a form which would reflect their opinion about academic environment, infrastructure in the college. There were 79 responses recorded out of which 25 teachers were Associate Professors and the rest 53 were Assistant Professors. Some of the basic observations that were recorded from the questionnaire are presented in the forms of graphs below:

Q1 – Aims of the Syllabi are clear to Teachers and Students?



57% of the respondents **strongly agree** that the aims of the syllabi are clear to teachers and students.


42% of the respondents **Agree** that the aims of the syllabi are clear to teachers and students.

45% of the respondents **Strongly Agree** that there are a sufficient number of elective papers in the programmes taught.


49% of the respondents **Agree** that there are a sufficient number of elective papers in the programmes taught.

39% of the respondents **Strongly Agree** that the programme syllabi taught is relevant and contemporary.


57% of the respondents **Agree** that the programme syllabi taught is relevant and contemporary.

48% of the respondents **Agree** that clean drinking water is available in the college.


3% of the respondents **Disagree** that clean drinking water is available in the college.

52% of the respondents **Agree** that Rest Rooms, Toilets, Laboratory, Playground, Classrooms are clean.


3% of the respondents **Disagree** that Rest Rooms, Toilets, Laboratory, Playground, Classrooms are clean.

32% of the respondents Strongly Agree that there is recognition of academic achievements by the college.


39% of the respondents **Agree** that there is recognition of academic achievements by the college.

6% of the respondents are **Not Sure** that there is recognition of academic achievements by the college.



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
Q7 - Students are Disciplined and Respectful to the Teachers and Staff?
