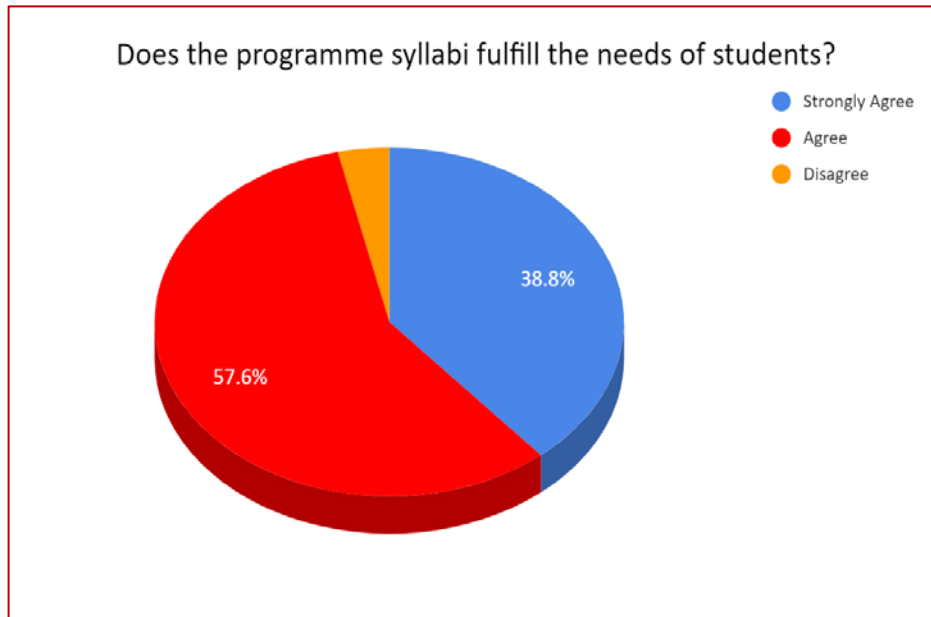
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TEACHER FEEDBACK 2017-18

From the year 2015-16, the college initiated the process of collecting feedback from teachers regarding academic satisfaction and their inputs about college infrastructure which would help the college to improve its facilities for the future. The college earlier existed as Ram Lal Anand College (Evening) and turned into a morning college as Aryabhatta College in the academic session 2015-16. The college decided in 2016-17 to collect feedback from both teachers and students. It was decided to collect feedback from teachers by requesting them to fill out a form which would reflect their opinion about academic environment, infrastructure in the college. There were 87 responses recorded out of which 23 teachers were Associate Professors and the rest 56 were Assistant Professors. Some of the basic observations that were recorded from the questionnaire are presented in the forms of graphs below:

1. Do the Programme syllabi fulfill the needs of the students?

57.6% of the respondents **Agree** that the programme syllabi fulfill the needs of



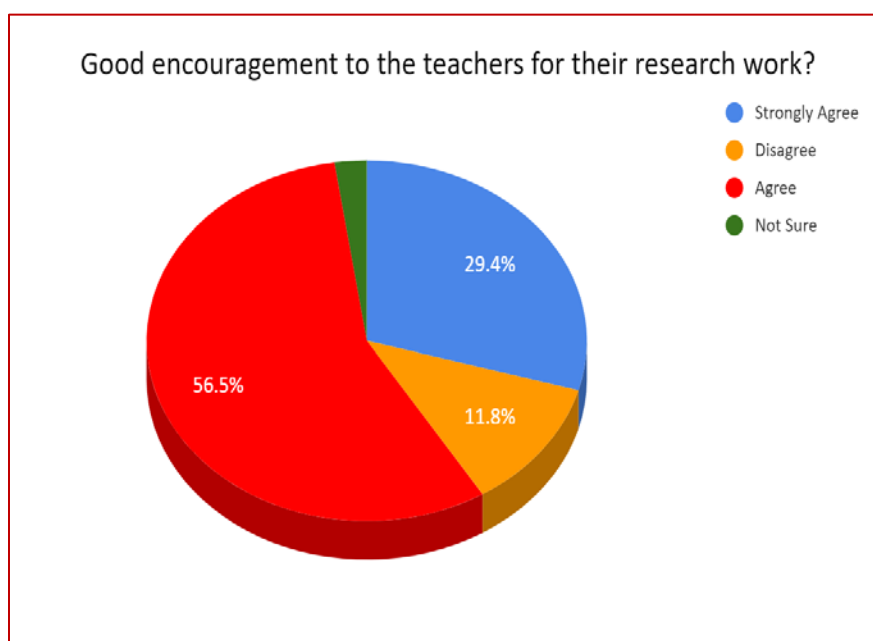
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students.

11.8% of the respondents **Disagree** with the question that the college provides good encouragement to the teachers for their research work

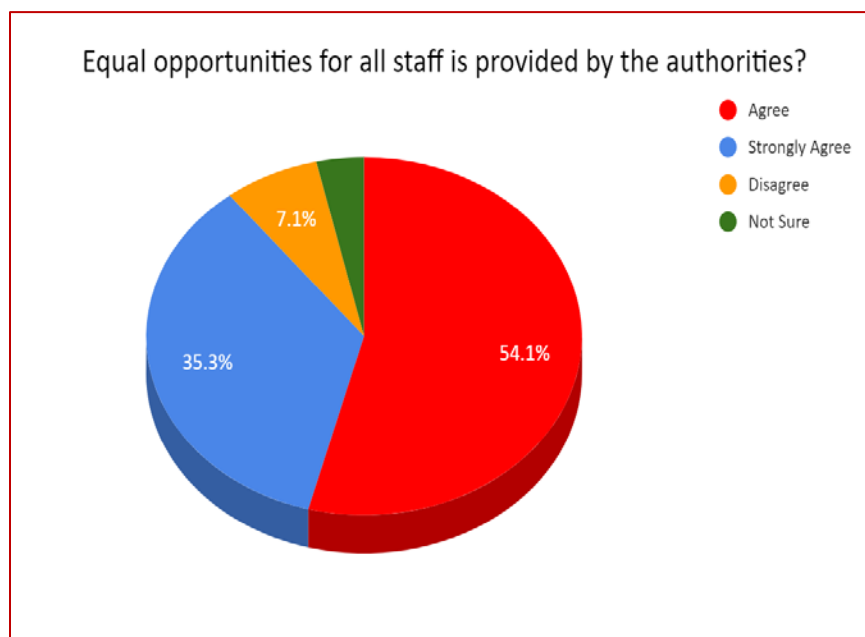
2.3% of the respondents reported **Not Sure**.

7.1% of the respondents **Disagree** that the college provides equal opportunities for all members of the staff.

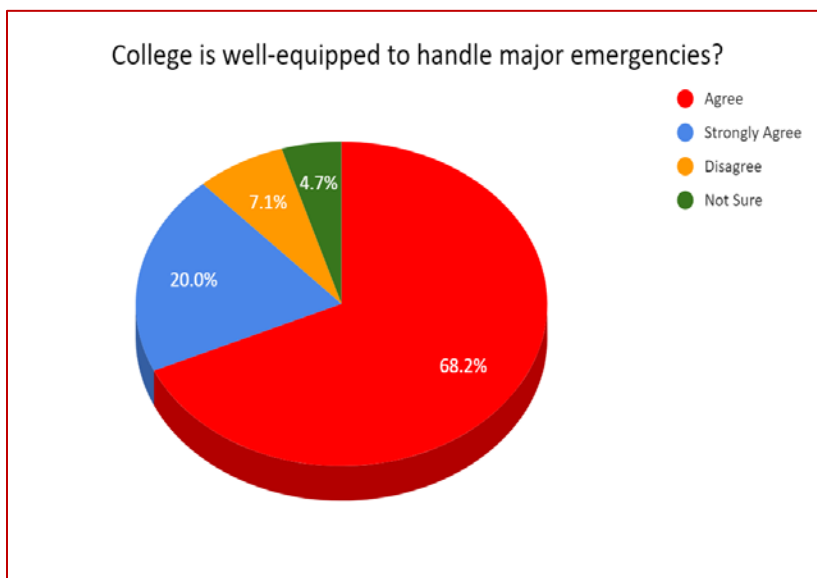
3.5% of the respondents reported **Not Sure**.

7.1% of the respondents **Disagree** that the college is well-equipped to handle major emergencies.

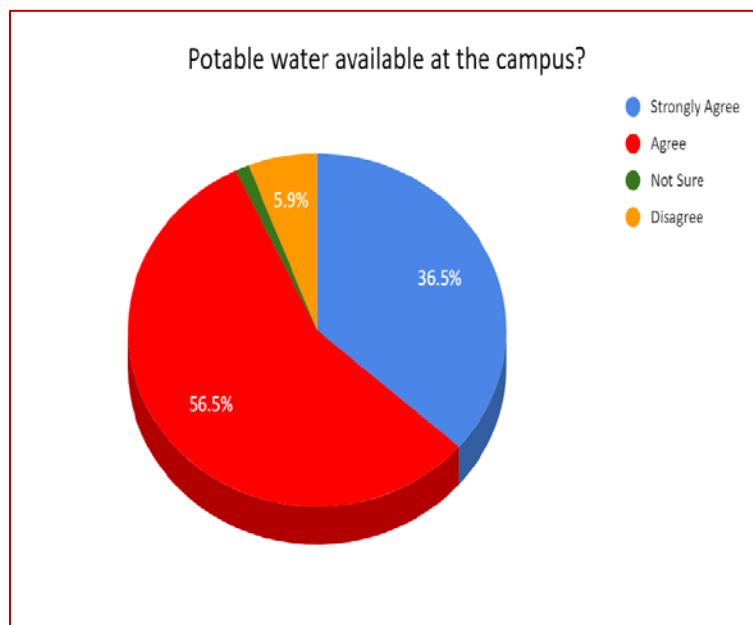
4.7% of the respondents reported **Not Sure**.

5.9% of the respondents **Disagree** that potable water is available on campus.

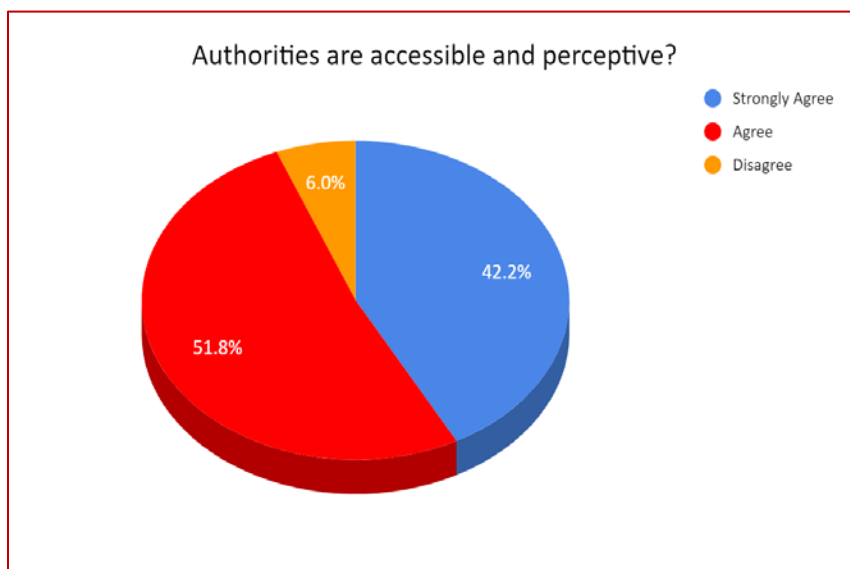
1.1% of the respondents reported **Not Sure**.

51.8% of the respondents **Agree** that authorities are accessible and perceptive

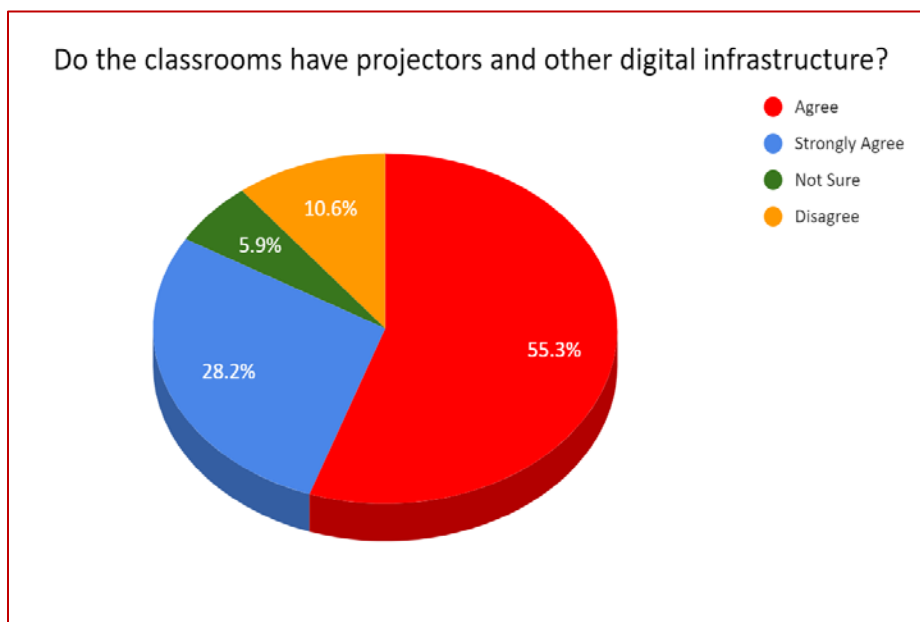
6% of the respondents **Disagree** that authorities are accessible and perceptive.

10.6% of the respondents **Disagree** that classrooms have projectors and other digital infrastructure.

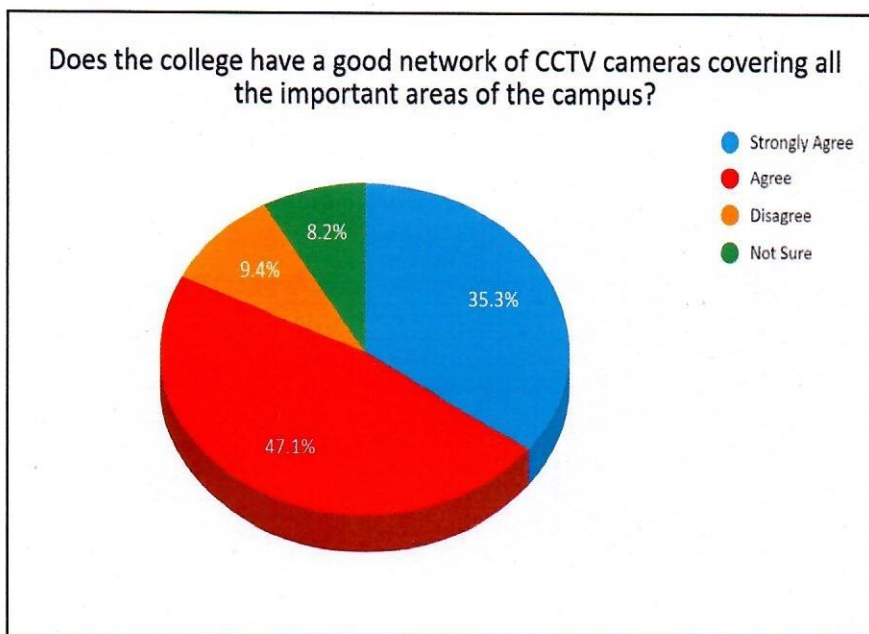
5.9% of the respondents reported **Not Sure**.
