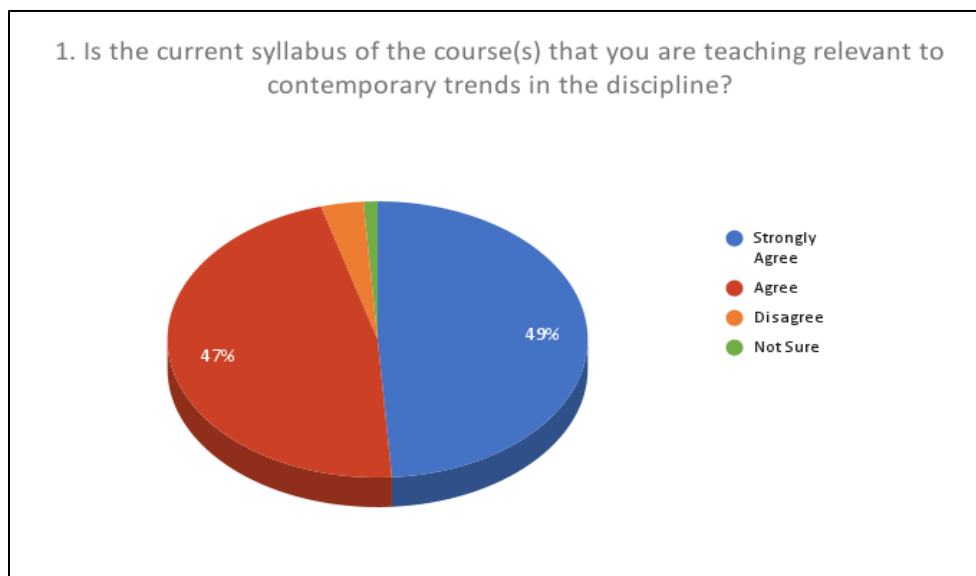

FEEDBACK REPORT - TEACHER'S FEEDBACK (2019-20)

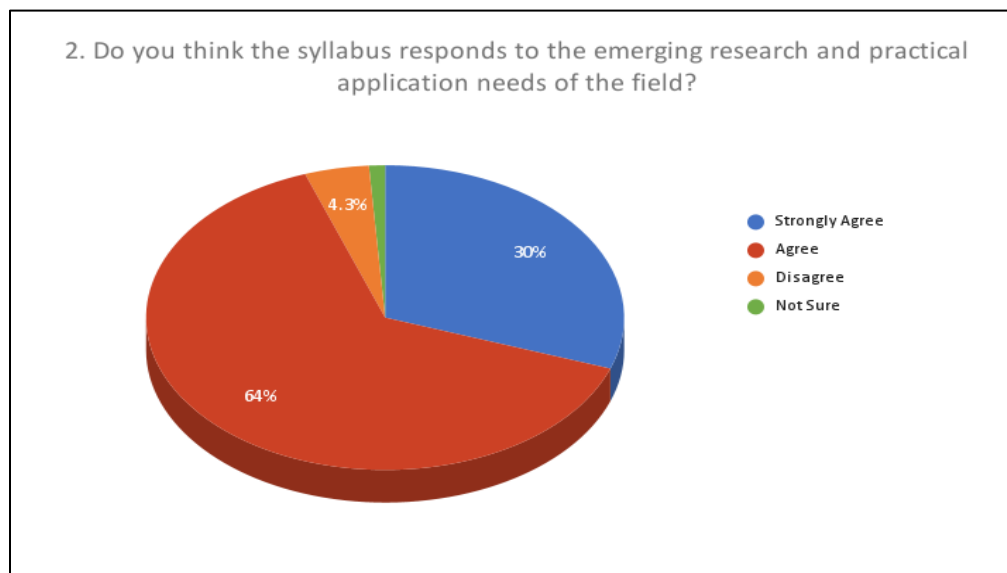
From the year 2015-16, the college initiated the process of collecting feedback from teachers regarding academic satisfaction and their inputs about college infrastructure which would help the college to improve its facilities for the future. The college earlier existed as Ram Lal Anand College (Evening) and turned into a morning college as Aryabhatta College in the academic session 2015-16. From the year 2016-17, feedback is also collected from students in an online mode. It was decided to collect feedback from teachers by requesting them to fill out a form which would reflect their opinion about academic environment, infrastructure in the college. As the teachers are mostly present on the campus, it was feasible to collect the feedback from them on the campus. There were 95 responses recorded out of which 20 teachers were Associate Professors and the rest 74 were Assistant Professors. Some of the basic observations that were recorded from the questionnaire are presented in the forms of graphs below:

1% of the respondents reported **Not Sure**.

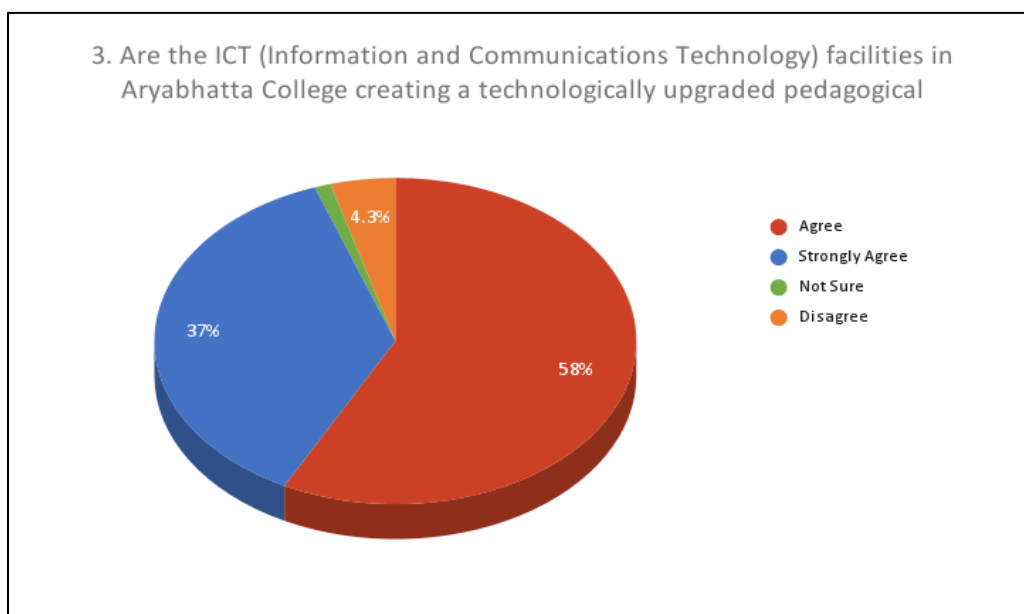


30% of the respondents **Strongly Agree** that the syllabus responds to the emerging research and practical application needs of the field.

1.7% of the respondents reported **Not Sure**.

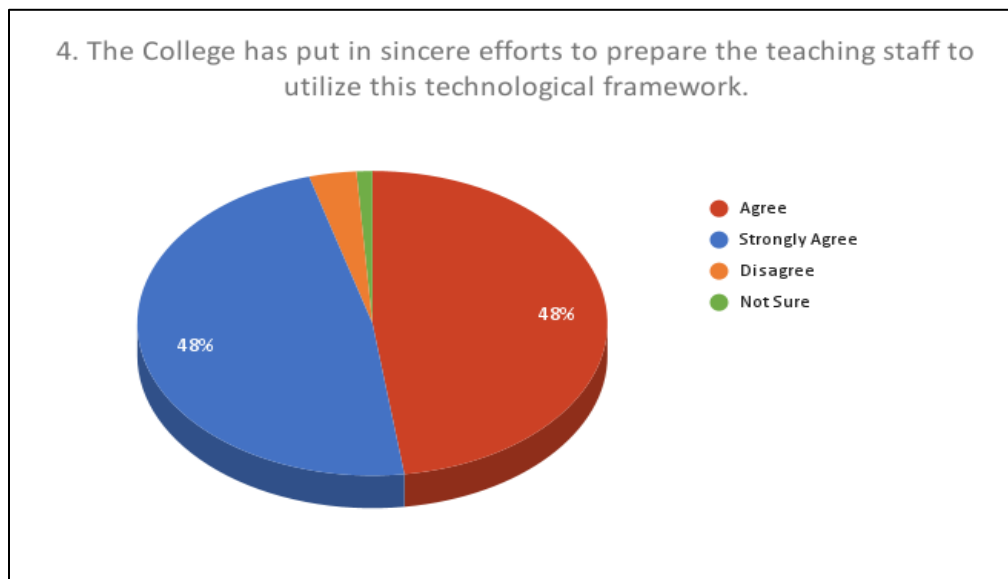

0.7% of the respondents reported **Not Sure**.



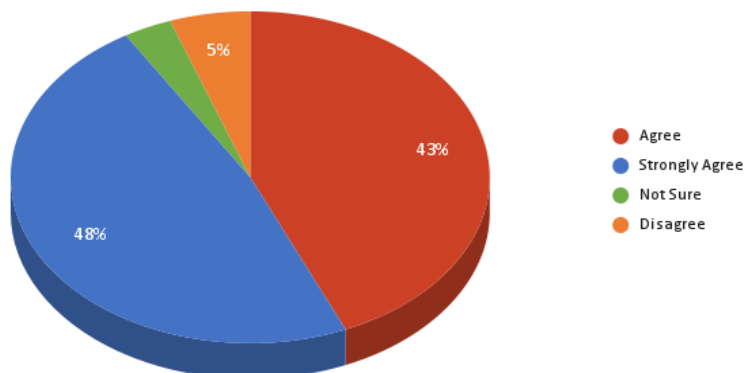
48% of the respondents **Strongly Agree** that the College has put in sincere efforts to prepare the teaching staff to utilize this technological framework.

5. Does the College have a good network of CCTV cameras covering all the important areas of the campus?



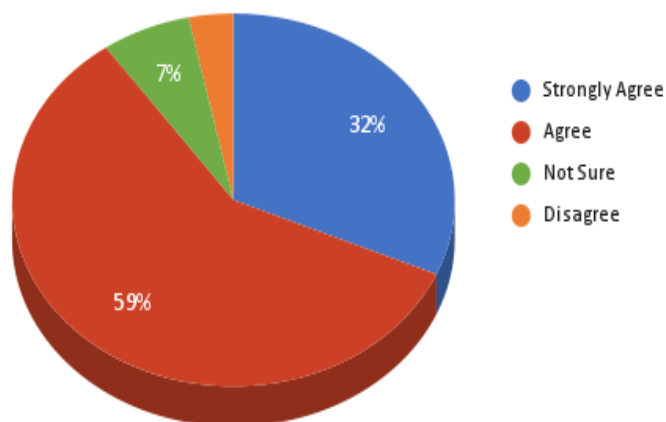
48% of the respondents **Strongly Agree** that the College has a good network of CCTV cameras covering all the important areas of the campus.

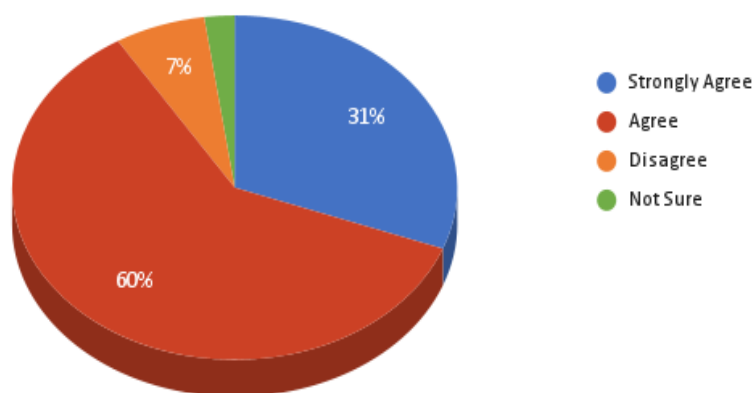

7. Is the study material available for students and teachers in the college library?



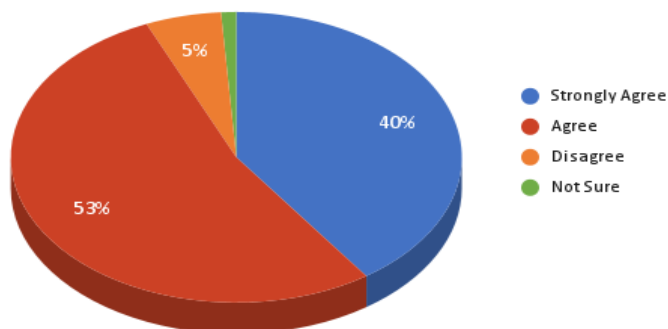
31% of the respondents **Strongly Agree** that the study material is available for students and teachers in the college library.

8. Are the administrative staff efficient and well behaved in their dealing with teachers and students?



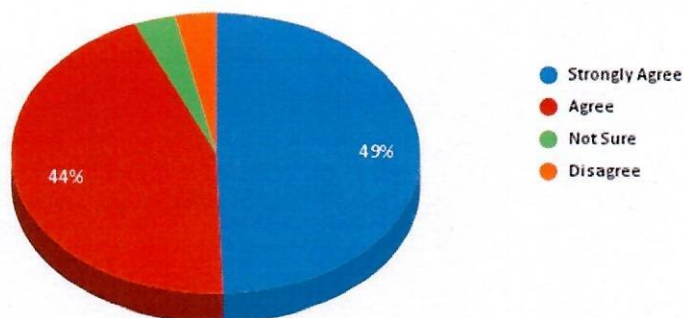
40% of the respondents **Strongly Agree** that the administrative staff is efficient and well behaved in their dealing with teachers and students
