Their posters were used to spread awareness during our awareness drive in the campus and the adopted slum.





2. Awareness drive- (23rd November 2021) (Timing: 12:30 P.M. To 3:00 P.M)



It was held on 23rd of October 2021 covering our campus and adopted slum. The drive started at 12:30 p.m. and ended at 3:00 p.m. Our NSS Unit was initiated to teach people and make them aware of the harmful effects of tobacco and the leading hazardous situations.

Our NSS Volunteer Gaurav Bagdi gave a small speech about the harmful effects of tobacco and ways to prevent and heal from the habit.
