9) SWOC (Strength, Weakness, Opportunities, Challenges) Analysis of the Department

- 1. Strength
 - Most faculty members have a PhD. and M. Phil qualification from reputed institutions.
 - The research work in terms of publication is a strong point of the department.
 - Participation of the faculty members in seminar/workshops is encouraging and both quantity and quality seems to be improving.
 - There is increased participation by the faculty members in international conferences
 - Besides academics, the department members, teachers as well as students are participating in extra-curricular activities including social projects like 'gyanodaya'

2. Weakness

- Some members of the faculty, although pursuing Ph. D., have yet to complete it.
 Once they do so, the academic profile of the department would further strengthen.
- While the students are participating in extra-curricular activities, including the
 organization of a festival, such participation is on a limited scale, the
 department would have to make more efforts to improve upon this.
- Many activities that are carried out by the students are not well documented by the department.
- There is very little extra-campus activity by the students.

3. Challenges

- In order to improve better contact and student participation, nationally and internationally, there is need to contact and maintain contact with the alumni of the college.
- In order to record the activities of the students, resources need to be devoted to the capturing and recording the activities.
- Improving audio-visual equipment in the college in order to make the teaching and extra-curricular activities more engaging for the students.

10) Future Plans of the Department

- Increase participation in social outreach and community development programmes.
- Provide ample choices to the students for Discipline Specific Papers (DSE)
- Finetune lecture delivery and other projects to the emerging audio-visual facilities in the field of education.
