7. Co-curricular Programmes conducted by the Department

The Political Science Society had its Annual Diary full with multiple events happening throughout the academic session 2015-2016:

The Society kick started its calendar by organizing a day-long session on 'Nehru and Modernity in Contemporary India' on 9th September 2015. On 29^{th}

September 2015 a talk by Dr. Ashok Kumar was organized on the theme- "India's development path in the era of neo-liberal economic policies and its impact".

The following month saw yet another engaging session on a contemporary issue titled 'Samajik Arthik Sambandh me Jammu-Kashmir' (Jammu and Kashmir in the Context of Socio-Economic Relations).

Like every society, the Political Science Society too hosted a two day inter-college festival- CONFLUENCE. Aiming to do something different, the Society held a book discussion on 'Swatrantyotar Bhartiya Rajniti' on 27th February 2016.

The Society closed its yearly activities by successfully hosting a two day National Seminar on 'Political Leadership in Independent India: Challenges and Emerging Issues' held in March 2016. The seminar on "Political Leadership in Independent India: Challenges and Emerging Trends" was essentially an attempt to engage critically with the issues, trends and challenges which are occurring in the Political leadership of the biggest democracy in the world. It is often said that India is a distinctive case of democracy where the traditional indicators of democratic governance are either fractured or manipulated. Nevertheless, because of democratic handling of diversity by Political Leadership in India perhaps potentially it can be a model of democracy for what is popularly known as "Third-World countries". Here, the role of Political Leadership becomes extremely important that how and in what manner the leadership can guard and maintain the governance and democracy. Keeping this idea in mind, the seminar through its various sessions tried to engage with the various theoretical and analytical categories to understand the challenges and emerging trends in the practice of leadership in India. The seminar not only tried to unfold the theoretical debates surrounding the idea of Political Leadership but also the contemporary challenges that can be very helpful in understanding the transformations within the idea of Political Leadership. Especially, after postliberalization regime the style and substance of Political Leadership took a different turn from that of its earlier period. Also, the seminar endeavored to deliberate not only the domestic aspects of Political Leadership but also the experiences of Political Leadership in its interaction with international economic, social and political structures.

The seminar went on for two days and had six sessions besides the inaugural and the valedictorian ones. The inaugural session opened with the keynote address by eminent Political scientist Prof Peter D'Souza of CSDS and concluded with a round table and valedictory address by Dr. Chandan Mitra, editor of the Pioneer newspaper and a member of the Rajya sabha. The two days seminar was attended by large number of teachers and students and was marked by intense engagements among scholars working on Indian society and politics. The students and the faculty of the college got refreshed about new ideas on the theme of the seminar and exposed to scholarly debates and discussions.

9. (Strength ,Weakness , Opportunities, Challenges) SWOC Analysis of the Department

Strength: The department got new faculty members, who are young promising researchers and teachers. The first year of its existence in new incarnation as full-fledged institution as Aryabhatta college has opened new opportunities. One has been the high cut off in admission and entry of bright students in the department. The teachers have been pursuing their research with full dedication and devoting extra time on students due to the new course structure introduced through CBCS.

Chellenges: The transition from Evening to Day College has brought many challenges before the department. The new infrastructure is proving inadequate to meet the needs of the students and teachers. The inadequate library infrastructure is a matter of concern as there is very little space for students to study. The faculty has faced problem in dealing with three batches of students studying three different types of course structures - FYUP, Semester mode and CBCS.

Weakness: The department faces resource problem to organize as many academic activities as the students aspire. The college funds some of the activities, but they prove inadequate to meet the requirements. The department proposed to UGC to hold a national seminar and it was accepted. The department held a seminar on Political leadership in March 2016. But the grant given by UGC was not enough and the college had to bail the department out of the financial shortfall.

10. Future Plan:

The department wishes to hold more of national seminars and engage scholars of repute in occasional lecture series. The department has also resolved to create a departmental library under the supervision of a faculty member on rotation basis with students as members to assist the teacher convener. There is a proposal to undertake extension programmes for students to give them hands on experience.
