## 7. Co-curricular Programmes conducted by the Department:

Orientation programme has been one the regular feature the departmental academic activities. This year we invited Prof. Chintamani Mahapatra who presented before the newly admitted students the significance of Political Science as an academic discipline. He highlighted various aspects of Political Science including its day to day relationship with common people.

The Department in its lecture series organized lecture on the 25<sup>th</sup> year of new liberal economic reform initiated by Dr. Manmohan Singh during the P.V. Narsimha Rao Government. To have an assessment regarding the achievement of

goals set out in the economic reform we invited two distinguished professors Dr Ashok Kumar and Dr. Kartikey Kohli to speak on the issue with common people.

The department in its lecture series organized lecture discussion on 25 years of Indian Economic Reform: Challenges and way forward- part II by Dr. Kartikey Kohli, Associate Professor, Department of Economics on 7/10/2016 Aryabhatta College.

The Department of Political Science held a lecture on Research methodology to keep the academic requirement of budding scholars. How to conduct the research work pertaining to socio-political and economic issues, the discussion proved to be very beneficial. The speaker also highlighted the ethics of research as well. Prof. Vinay Shrivastava, Department of Anthropology, D.U. delivered Guest lecture on Research Methodology on 10/11/2016.

The department of Political Science invited Shri Kashmiri Lal on 08/02/2017 to speak on Indo-China trade relations in historic as well as in current perspective. China one of the immediate neighbors of India had a historic relations including trade but in late 1940s, after the regime change in China the relationship went through rough patches. What was the current status of affair and how to improve it was the major highlight of the talk.

The talk on Indo-Pakistan in the light of changing international scenario particular after the end of cold war and the rising influence of China was held. The distinguished speaker Ambassador P. Stobdon highlighted the new situation which emerged between China and Pakistan on 16/02/2017. The strategic investment by China in Pakistan was discussed as major challenge for India.

Dr. Shakti Sinha as director of Nehru Memorial Museum and Library and retired bureaucrat was invited to speak public policy since Nehruvian era on 28/02/2017. He expressed his critical opinion regarding the policy formulation during the Prime Ministership of Jawaharlal Nehru and the role of bureaucrat. He also highlighted how public policy has undergone changes particularly in the new liberal era.

The Department organized a lecture of Indrani Mazumdar, Jagmati Sangwan, Rukmini Sen, Gourab Ghosh, and Devangana Kalita on "Women's Movement and Gender Question: then and now" on 30/03/2017. It discussed -How does the women's movement look at the gender identity question? Is it about sustaining or dissolving identities? And How does the Women's movement takes note of class, caste or religion?

The Department Conducted Study tour of Jammu and Kashmir from 4/04/2017 to 10/04/2017 to expose the students to the discourse of Jammu and Kashmir: article 370, terrorism and separatism and role of army. The tour gave an opportunity to understand the different issues of state like governance, human rights, women status in society, trade, commerce and religious.

# 9. (Strength ,Weakness , Opportunities, Challenges) SWOC Analysis of the Department

**Strength**- The faculty strength has stabilized with the appointment of new faculty members. On the infrastructure front, the college has worked hard to furnish the new building. A new well-furnished seminar room has been added with proper sound and recording system. The library building has come up with relatively better sitting space for students. The college has got a sanction to add one new block in its infrastructure.

**Weakness-** There is still no space in the library for the faculty members to read and write. The Class rooms are proving to be inadequate to deal with the growing students' strength and new course structure under CBCS with number of optional papers and multiple choices to be offered under GE.

**Challenges**- Dealing with two batches with two different types of course structures continue, that is semester system and CBCS system. There continues to be mismatch between the infrastructure available and the needs of the department. The department is not being able to mobilize resources from outside for holding curricular and extra-curricular activities with industry and non-governmental funding agencies not showing interest in supporting with finances and sponsorship.

## 10. Future plan:

The department wishes to diversify its academic activities by collaborating with research institutes in social science and humanities. There is also a proposal to take students to different heritage sites in Delhi for more exposure. The annual departmental fest is being made for academic by organizing subject related quiz, paper writing completion, debate, etc without diluting the co-curricular and extra-curricular components. The department has decided to hold more national seminars, lectures besides working in direction of holding international seminar.
