# 9) SWOC (Strength ,Weakness , Opportunities, Challenges) Analysis of the Department

Strength

- The biggest strength of the department is the dynamic faculty which has ensured that the students have exposure to a myriad of curricular, co-curricular and extra-curricular events.
- Teachers have been actively and regularly taking their classes in the college. Students are constantly engaged in academic work and in other activities.
- The Department has started its annual magazine 'Viewpoint' which gives a platform to the students to express their thoughts and ideas about a particular situation.
- Some teachers in the department are actively engaged in research ehich adds to the research profile of the department and college. Their experience and knowledgebase would also help students to develop an orientation towards research.

#### Weakness

- Although some members are actively engaged in research, we still do not have enough research experience as a department resulting in lower publications.
- This year the department did not conduct enough talk, seminar or workshops for the students. These extra activities help the students have a better understanding of the subject
- Absence of a department research cell.
- Department has been trying to organize a national/international seminar but have not been able to materialize it.

#### Challenges

• One of the major challenges faced by the department is time management for both co-curricular activities and extra-curricular activities, and maintaining focusing on academic activities.

• Improving research profile of the students and motivating them to write an article for the magazine. Their ability to do an economic and quantitative analysis would help enhance the research profile of students.

#### **10) Future Plans of the Department**

- The Department plans to organize workshops on various social and economic database with speakers who are associated with government institutions which are involved in data collection and organization.
- The department is in the process of organizing an international seminar.
