7. Co-curricular Programmes conducted by the Department

The department of Political Science organized an orientation programme on 20th July, 2019 of newly admitted students of B.A (Honours) Political Science.

The Department organized a seminar on Restoring of Democracy in Kashmir on 3 September 2019 in Reading hall of Aryabhatta College. An eminent social worker Shriniwas was the guest speaker.

The Department organized a seminar on the topic-"ADR Mechanism In India: Shaping the Future of Dispute Resolution and Access to Justice" on 23 September ,2019.

The speaker for the seminar was Mr. Dinesh Dayma, Assistant Professor at Faculty of Law, University of Delhi, New Delhi.

In the seminar, Mr. Dinesh focused on Nature of Indian legal system and Alternative Dispute resolution mechanism. His contention was that today justice delivery system in India is on twisted road at the one end failure of formal law- Courts resulting in backlog of cases, and on the other end ADRs fails to get much need public support, under this circumstance it is essential to rethink on the new ways out for coming generation. Therefore, it is essential in this context to understand the various forms of ADRs, their development, and mode of working of ADRs so as to assess it pros, cons and applicability to the pluralistic Society of India.

National Seminar-

The Department of Political Science organized a Two Days National Seminar on "Pakistan Occupied Jammu and Kashmir: History, Politics, Economics and Culture" on 25-26 September 2019 with support of UGC. The primary objective of the conference was to enhance understanding about the region and politics surrounding it. It encourages scholars from the field of Academics, Law, History and Defense to come and share their views. Pakistan occupied Jammu and Kashmir is historically, legally and culturally a part of India and due to its geo-political and geo-strategic location it attracts the attention of all neighboring states and big powers. The

conference has also discussed the state sponsored terrorism and fuelling fundamentalism by the state of Pakistan. Separatism, secessionism and sectarian violence were the important challenges and part of discussion.

Visit to Parliament and Mughal Garden-

The Department of Political Science has successfully organized an educational trip for students and faculty members, a visit to Parliament and Mughal garden on 11 February 2020 to provide them the wider social, political and linguistic interrelationships of how 'democracy' and 'education' are understood and how 'democracy-comes-into-being' in the specific context of education.

Film Screening-

The Political Science Society of Aryabhatta College organized the screening of the movie "Article 15" in the seminar room of the college successfully on 24th January 2020. The screening witnessed the participation of a large number of students along with faculty members. The movie screening was followed by a discussion on the issue of Caste system and the ways in which the system discriminates the lower caste community that was again nicely portrayed in the movie.

Invited Lecture-

The department of Political Science, Aryabhatta college organised a webinar on: Gandhi and Sustainable Development in Present Context by Dr. Anil Dutta Mishra. Dr. Mishra is a distinguished Gandhian scholar and writer. Presently, he is the Editor of Sulabh India and Senior Vice-President Sulabh International Social Service Organization, New Delhi. He has authored/edited more than 30 books and published more than hundred research paper. In this webinar, the main focus was on the ideas of Gandhi on Sustainability and Development. "Earth provides enough to satisfy every man's need but not any man's greed." According to the speaker Gandhi's basic aim was to have an all-round development of the society that included human development along with socio-economic-political development. Gandhi envisages a healthy society based on harmony and dialogue, where the ideas of equality and justice are translated in the lives of teeming millions. Dr. Mishra brings light to the concepts of 'Sarvodaya', 'Swaraj' and 'Gram Swaraj'.

The department of Political Science, Aryabhatta college organised a webinar on: Covid Emergency: Re - Imagining Education on 27th May 2020 Wednesday,by Dr. Sanjeev Rai. 9. (Strength ,Weakness , Opportunities, Challenges) SWOC Analysis of the Department

Strength:

the college has emerged as frontline institution in the south campus with political science department continuing to hold on to its reputation as premier department of the college due to result of the students and teaching and research ability of the faculty members. The department has seen a very wide catchment area for students, with large number of students coming from distant place, the gender balance of the class is another positive of last few years. The enthusiasm and involvement of students and faculty in the departmental activities hold out hope for the future.

Weakness:

The infrastructure is major concern at the moment. Although the upcoming multistoried building is going to mitigate the pressure, but still separate space for teachers to do research is not in sight. The pandemic has posed new challenges for the department with the students located in far flung areas and the online mode of teaching since March due to the lockdown. The rescheduling of the session and open book examination has added to the difficulty. Many unprivileged students facing problem of electronic gadgets to attend online classes is major reason of concern along with the digital divide.

Challenges:

The education sector is facing extraordinary situation due to the pandemic and the department is no exception. The teachers and the college administration have been in touch with the students and have tried to rise to the occasion to help the needy students. But the challenges are onerous and the resources are scarce to meet the challenges at hands. The crisis created by the pandemic has put a halt to many planned academic activities due to physical absence of students from the campus.
