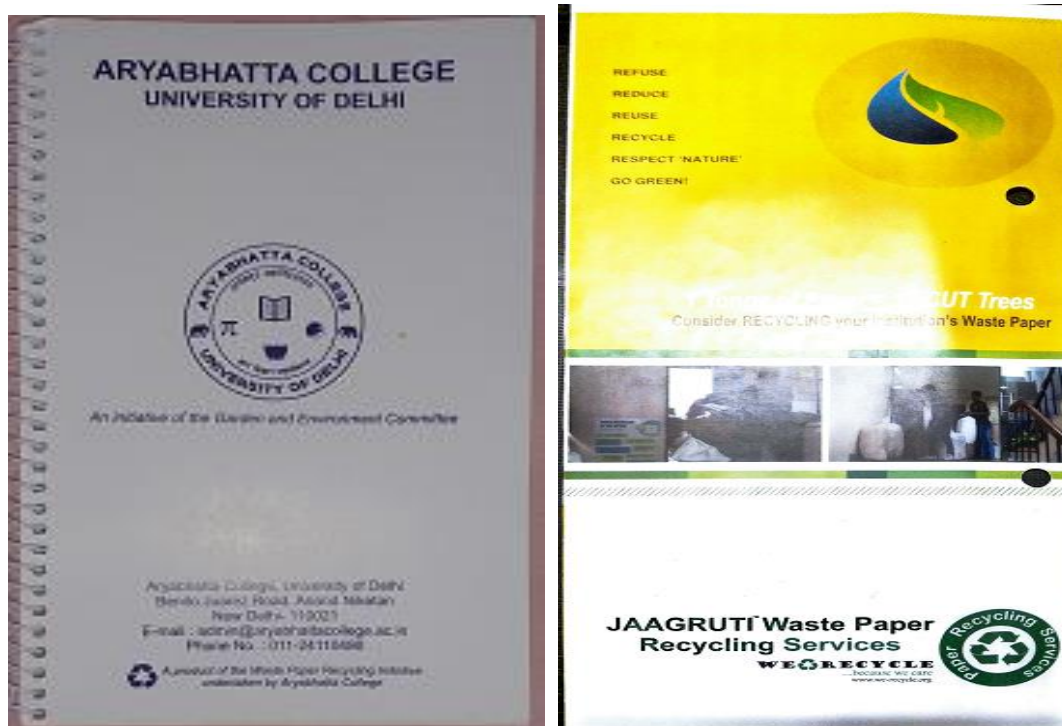

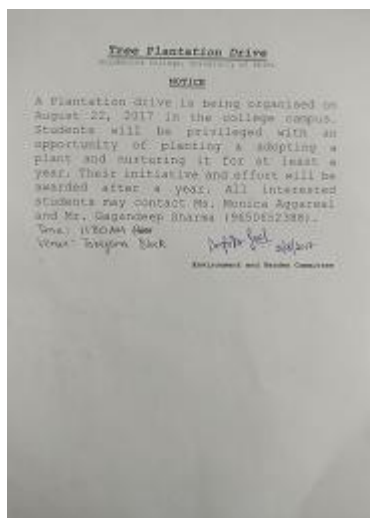

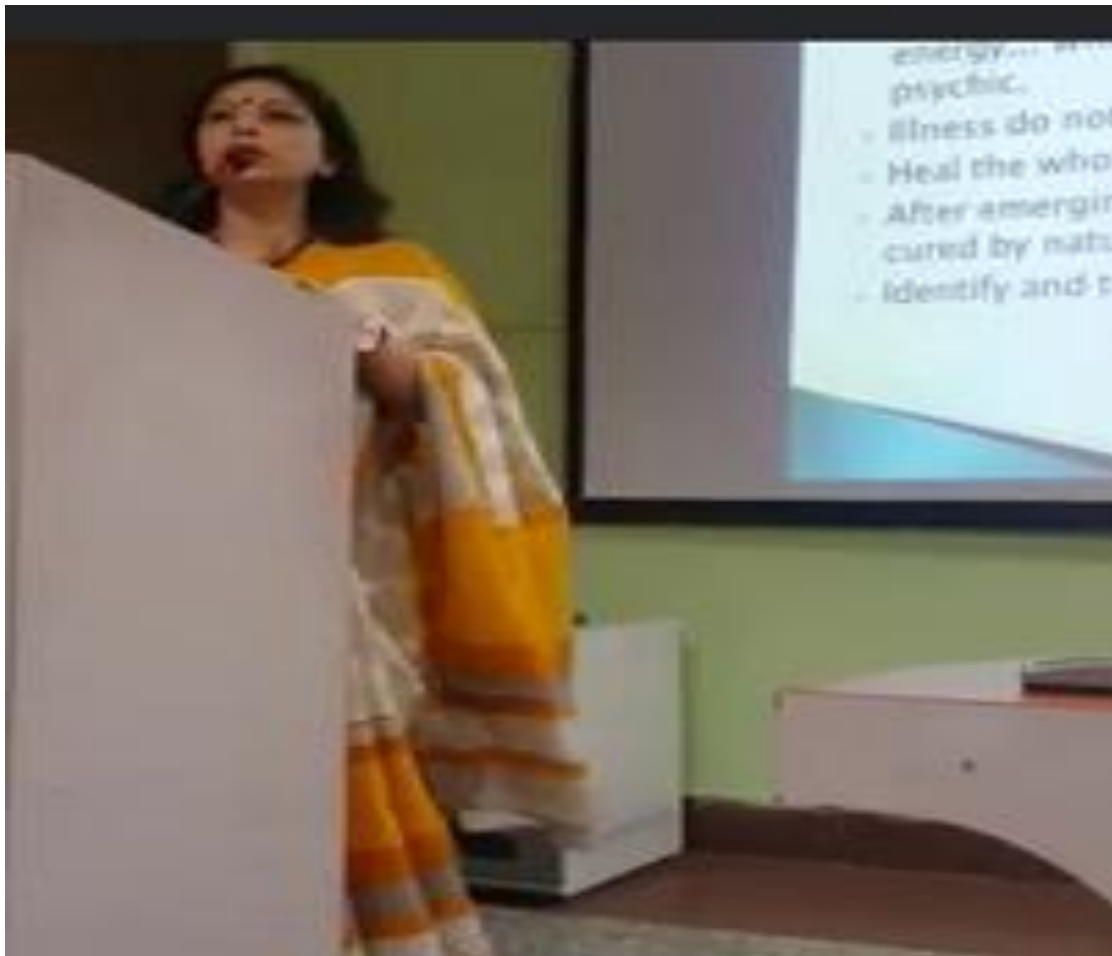
Herbal medicine is one of the oldest forms of medical treatment and can be considered as one of the forerunners of modern pharmaceutical treatment. Their use range from the treatment of common cough & cold to more serious ailments like diabetes, high blood pressure, obesity etc. The plants having medicinal properties and commonly used for the manufacture of herbal medicines are tulsi, aloe vera, turmeric, Amla, lavender, ginger etc.

Herbal medicines are cheap and so easily affordable by the poor, have less side effects than allopathic medicines and can be grown at home. Moreover it can be taken alongside regular diet. So herbal medicines are becoming popular in the country.

The Seminar was well attended by the teachers and the students.
