The poetry competition, themed *Sonnets, Soliloquy, and Scandal*, gave budding poets the chance to present original works in the Renaissance style while voicing contemporary concerns. The highlight of the day was the cosplay competition, *Renaissance Revelry: A Cosplay Affair*, where students dressed as iconic Renaissance characters, showcasing their creativity, costume design skills, and dramatic flair.

Throughout the day, students and audience members engaged in an open-mic session, sharing their favourite Renaissance quotes, performing impromptu readings, and celebrating literary expression in a relaxed and interactive manner.

The programme concluded with a vote of thanks by Ms. Alka Lakhera, Teacher-in-Charge of the Department of English, who commended the organizing team, faculty, and students for making Calypso 2025 a resounding success.
