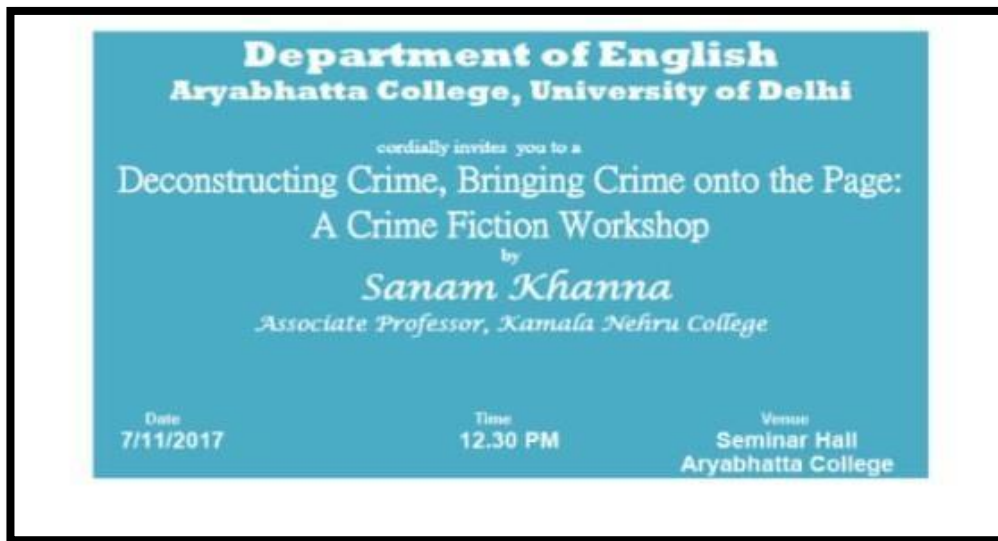

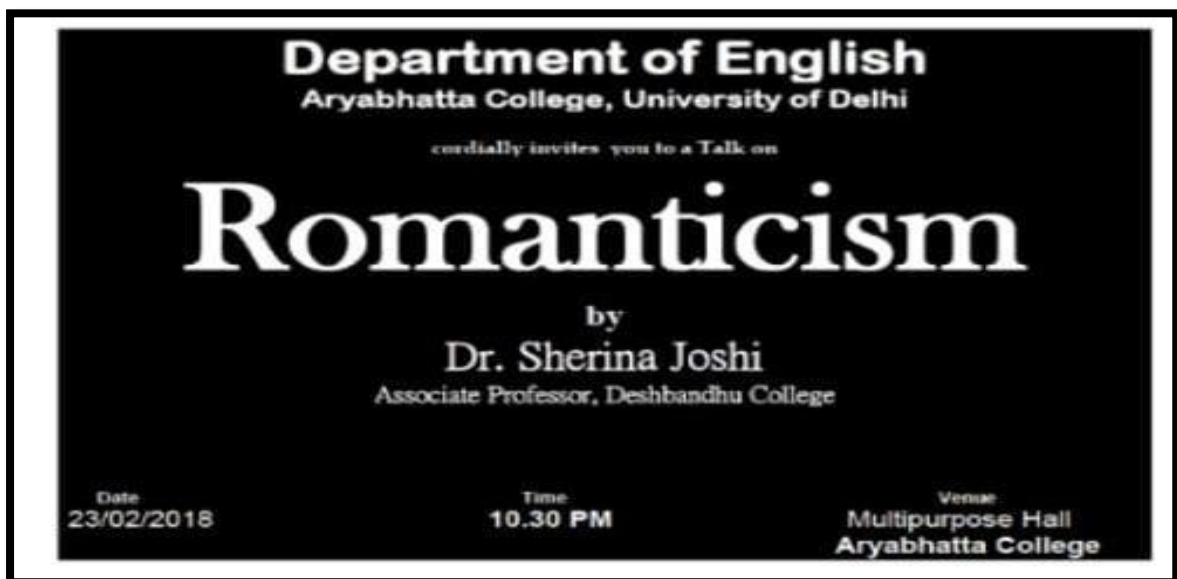


The workshop was well appreciated by almost 50 participants along with 8-10 faculty members.
