

To introduce the students with sagacious concepts of research proposal writing, Srijan, the psychology department association of Aryabhatta College organised an interactive workshop on September 20, 2023. The session was facilitated by the resource person <u>Dr.Ankit Prakash</u>, Assistant Professor, Department of Psychology, Aryabhatta College. He is a distinguished scholar, Post-Doctoral Fellow and beacon of knowledge in the field of research. The event was marked by the presence of 3 faculty members and 59 students of the college.

The hosts of the event, Avi Jain and Sejal began with a formal introduction of the session, inviting Dr. Neera, the faculty in the

psychology department who kickstarted the session with a formal overview and insights on the theme of research writing. She also provided an introductory explanation on how one can execute research in various fields, further inviting Dr. Ankit Prakash for beginning the workshop. He began with the basic understanding of the concept of research and the objectives to be kept in mind while formulating a proposal for the research writing. He introduced the audience with footsteps of writing a research proposal starting from the identification of an area of interest to the methods required for research. He further went on to explaining that the planned research should contribute to the existing knowledge and bridge the gap in the



area of research chosen. Ultimately the research proposal needs to be distinct with the statement of the problem and must provide a valid justification for the particular study.

Dr. Ankit then introduced students to the concept of publication and ethics to follow in conducting research. He also familiarised the students with the necessary precautions one must take while writing a research proposal, shedding light on legitimate research websites, journals, articles and so on which eventually formulate the reference or review of literature for the respective research. Dr. Ankit concluded the event



with research proposal writing dynamics and an interactive doubts' session.
